

Ooredoo among top 50 brands

oredoo is the fastest-growing of any of the major telecoms brands in the region, rising in value by 48% from 2016 to 2017 and featuring in the top 50 telecoms brands in the world, according to a new report by leading valuation and strategy consultancy Brand Finance. According to the report, Ooredoo's

brand value has consistently increased since the company began increased since the company began its global brand roll-out, which the report calculates as \$3.1bn in 2017. With more than 138 million custom-ers, the Ooredoo brand is becoming one of the most widely-recognised communications brands in the world

The news comes as Ooredoo hosts one of its largest and most technolog-ically-advanced product demonstrations at Mobile World Con-

demonstrations at Mobile World Con-gress 2017 taking place in Barcelona this week, said a press release. The report, Telecoms 500 2017, values the brands of operators and infrastructure companies around the

world. Brands are first evaluated to determine their strength, based on factors such as marketing investment, tactors such as marketing investment, familiarity, loyalty, staff satisfaction and corporate reputation, and this is used to determine what proportion of a business's revenue is contributed by the brand. This information is then used to rank the world's 500 most valua-ble telecoms brands. Ooredoo has risen to become the 47th biggest telecoms brand in 2017, appearing in the top 50 for the first time in its

history.

Many motorists caught for wrong overtaking

any erring motorists have been caught as the traffic authorities have intensified monitoring on vehicles engaging in wrong overtaking and other serious violations of the traffic. serious violations of the traffic law.

law.
The vehicles caught flouting the rules have been summoned to the Vehicles Seizure Section of the Traffic Department located at street No. 52 of Doha-Indus-trial Area.

Article 64 of the Traffic Law has stipulated jail for one week up to one year and fines of QR3,000 to QR10,000 for viola-tions including wrong overtaking. The revised traffic law provides for a reconciliation paying a fine of OR1.000.

Overtaking at "continuous line" leading to exits and inter-sections will also result in similar

punishments. Many motorists unaware of this rule have been caught by the radars or the traf-fic patrolling team, *The Peninsula* has learnt.

"I received a message on Sunday night from the Traffic Department through Metrash notifying about a traffic violanotifying about a traine viola-tion (wrong overtaking) by my car and asking me to report to the seizure section", a motorist told *The Peninsula*.

"The next day early morning

I visited the investigation unit of the seizure section of Traffic Department at street No. 52 of Doha-Industrial Area. The offi-cial at the counter asked me to pay a fine of QRI,000 and warned me of a seizure of my vehicle for a month in case of repetition of the violation,"

"After paying the fine I received a message which read "vehicle plate No. ... is no longer wanted by investigations section," he added.

Representative of contract-ing company said a bus belonging to his company was seized for two weeks for repeated violation two days in a

The bus was caught earlier for wrong overtaking and was given a warning. The authorities have been

tough over such violations and no leniency has been shown in terms of punishment, it has been learnt.

Sidra's research branch opens three main labs

idra's research branch has opened three main labs and the state-ofthe-art facilities have been brought into operation recently with high calibre expert teams from all over the

The outstanding translational research infrastructure at Sidra research infrastructure at Sidra aims to enable the implementa-tion of precision medicine, said Dr Ena Wang, Acting Chief Research Officer at Sidra. "Sidra's research branch

aims to advance the understanding of the pathophysiological mechanisms of diseases, develop early prevention, accurate diagnostic and advance therapeutics and improve the health outcomes of the women and children of Qatar," said Dr Wang yesterday on sidelines of a media tour of the labs.

"Our research teams are cur rently working on several research programmes that align with national priorities and health care needs to help facilitate prevention, early and targeted intervention for certain conditions such as cancer, obes-ity, preterm birth and genetic


The three labs which are operational at Sidra are namely Omics Core, Genomics Core and Deep Phenotyping Core and the fourth core lab, a Clinical Research Center is under

development.

"The state-of-the-art facilities have been brought into operation and are staffed by high calibre scientific teams," said Dr Wang.
"We are competitive at an

international level now, creating comprehensive Qatari genomic databases which will form the building blocks for Precision Medicine, not only in Qatar, but





in the wider Middle East," said

The Omics Core lab at Sidra can help with the extraction of DNA from a range of sample types including saliva and blood samples, the Genomic Core lab handles sequencing of DNA extraction samples and the Deep Phenotyping Core (DPC) Labs possesses technologies some of which are unique to the whole Middle East and North Africa

Region.
"The Genomic Core lab can support clinical requests inter nally but also again at a national

and international level. We can support clinical whole genome sequencing and clinical testing requests. At a national level, we requests. At a national revei, we provided the sequencing support for the first phase of the Qatar Genome Program," said Max Renault, the Director of Research Operations at Sidra.

Operations at Sidra.

Sidra is also preparing to open a Zebrafish facility and it would provide researchers access to state of the art equipment and facilities for studying vertebrate development biology and developing zebrafish mod-

"As a biological system, the zebrafish model offers distinct advantages for researchers. It has stable, easily observable and testable development behaviors. It is cost-effective, its genome is fully sequenced and its embryonic development is very rapid," said Wei Liu,

is very rapid, said wei Liu, Director of Clinical Genomic Core at Sidra. "It will be a key facility for identifying genes in disorders like cancers and cardio-vascu-landisocation bursance and hole lar disease in humans, and help identify potential new treat ments." he added.

Further at a national level Sidra's research branch has collaborations with Qatar Genome Programme, Qatar University Oatar Biomedical Research Insti tute, Qatar Biobank, Weill Cornell Medicine in Qatar, Texas A&M, National Center for Cancer Care and Research, Interim Translational Research Institution (iTRI) Hamad Bin Khalifa University Anti-Doping Lab Qatar. Also at an international level Sidra is working in close collaboration with organisations from the United States, Europe, Thailand
